The lyrics come from "Defense of Fort McHenry", a poem written in 1814 by the 35-year-old lawyer and amateur poet, Francis Scott Key, after witnessing the bombardment of Fort McHenry by the British Royal Navy ships in Chesapeake Bay during the Battle of Fort McHenry in the War of 1812.

The first and last verses of 4 verses written appears below:

O say can you see by the dawn's early light.

What so proudly we hailed at the twilight's last gleaming,

Whose broad stripes and bright stars through the perilous fight.

O're ramparts we watched, were so gallantly streaming?

And the rockets' red glare, the bombs bursting in air,

We're back from *Campfirmation*, our study retreat with the pastors and rising 9th graders in our cluster of 11 churches. This year at *Campfirmation* (where we teach a year's worth of confirmation in one week at our camp Lutheridge) our kids got a chance to act out an important Baptismal teaching.

The scripture comes from 1st Peter:

And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you—not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good con-

science, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

(3:21-22)

Our confirmands were offered an opportunity to jump into a mud pit where, as you can imagine, they got filthy dirty. The mud symbolized our sins. So after sliding around in the wet, black dirt, they were hosed off with "baptismal" water as a way of reminding them of the saving power of our Baptism. As Martin Luther says in his small catechism: Baptism brings about forgiveness of sins, redeems from death and the devil, and gives eternal salvation to all who believe it, as the Word and promise of God declare.

It was a great learning tool for **Aaron, Cooper, Madison, and Noah! And for me...**until they decided to give me a MUD hug after they frolicked in the pit! (Pictures below)

There will be pictures of the entire week's activities posted outside the church soon. I am so proud of the group that went this week --- for their willingness to participate in all our learning events and in all the camp's activities including games, swimming, crafts, etc. Yes, we feel a bit cleaner, somewhat transformed, closer as maturing individuals, but we also have explored together the way to renew ourselves again and again through God's gift of conscience.
