

The sound systems in the church are over 20 years old and very antiquated. Much of it is in disrepair and needs to be replaced as soon as possible. We have decided to address our immediate needs in worship and music as we look to our future with of all the technology possibilities all around us. Since there is no adequate space in the balcony for our new sound equipment and since we will need volunteers to manage this equipment during services, we need space in the nave of the church to monitor it effectively.

Thus, our Church Council has approved the building of a Sound and Video booth that will be built in the back of the church on the right side (as you face the altar). This means we will have to relocate the back two pews to the front of the Church to maintain the numbers of seats in the church and the new 6x8 booth will be built in that space. All the sound equipment from the balcony and narthex will be relocated to the new booth. At the same time, we will upgrade the electrical and wiring to serve our church in the future. **There will be new speakers installed to improve the sound in the sanctuary.**
