Birthstone: Topaz/Citrine Birth Flower: Chrysanthemum

1: Michelangelo's paintings on ceiling of Sistine Chapel were first exhibited. 1512 2: James K. Polk (1795-1849) the 11th US President was born in Mecklenburg County, NC. 1795

8: X-rays (electromagnetic rays) were discovered by Wilhelm Roentgen at the University of Wuerzburg in Germany. 1895

The November 1992 installation of our current instrument occurred on our 75th Anniversary Sunday. While the organ was not playable that day, it was a visual site to behold. All the stops were pulled for the first time on Christmas Eve of that year! During our Thanksgiving/ Advent Luncheon we will show the film of the installation and renovation of the pipe organ. Filmed here at Holy Comforter, as well as at the factory in Indianapolis. Indiana, this video show sections of the instrument that can only be seen while standing in the chambers. Trivia: Cost in 1992 was \$250,000. Replacement cost today is \$800,000. Number of pipes: 1883.

Thank you all for honoring me with the recent installation of the newest window at Holy Comforter. Located in the far right window inside the choir room is a window which depicts a variety of musical instruments which this musician in residence has attempted to master over the years. I chuckled during the dedication reading of Psalm 150 when I mentally paraphrased: Praise Him with Loud Saxophones, Accordion, Kazoo, and Harmonica! The window actually displays organ pipes, piano, saxophone, handbells, and director baton.
