

Dear Friends in Christ,

How is your Lenten journey to the cross going? This 40 day Spiritual walk with Jesus. Lent is a season of soul-searching and repentance. It is a season for reflection and taking Spiritual stock.

Many believers "give up" something during Lent as a Spiritual discipline. Rather than "give up" I have always chosen to "give in" – to give in to Jesus' love and grace in ways I might not throughout the rest of the Church year.

John 3:16 (above) is a good place to begin to "give in." Martin Luther called John 3:16 "the heart of the Bible – the Gospel in miniature."

Are you familiar with *Lectio Divina*? It means "divine reading" or "Spiritual reading" or "holy reading," a practice of prayer and scriptural reading intended to promote communion/fellowship with God as you read God's Word. It's a way of *praying the scripture*, calling one to study, ponder, listen and pray as you read. Try it with John 3:16 as well as with other verses during your Lenten pilgrimage. Answer the following questions in your heart or journal them or invite another person or two to do this as a group ...

- 1. Begin with a few moments of silent prayer.
- 2. **Read** the scripture out loud, slowly. Pause and ponder.
- 3. What **word or phrase** caught your attention? Meditate on that word or phrase.
- 4. **Read the passage again** out loud, slowly.
- 5. Where does this passage <u>touch my life</u> today? What does it say to me personally?
- 6. Read the passage a 3rd time out loud, slowly.
- 7. What does <u>God want me to do</u> or be this week because of this verse? How does God invite a <u>change</u> in me through His Holy Spirit?
- 8. End by praying the **Lord's Prayer**.

Friends, may God's Spirit invite you into many moments of holy reading during these 40 days of Lent. Know that you are loved eternally by the One we call Jesus!
