## Sanctuary Improvement Project

I wanted to let you know more about the upcoming Sanctuary project that is part of a larger improvement plan that has been going on for over a year. These improvements stem from a large donation we received over 2 years ago from an anonymous donor. The first phase of the project was renovation of balcony (choir loft) and the new carpet at the altar. The second phase will be to replace all the lighting in side and outside the church and repair and paint the ceiling in the Sanctuary.

The lighting project is crucial for safety, maintenance and economics of the building. Our lighting system is over 54 years old and while it was state-of-the-art at the time, it is difficult and expensive to maintain today due to the inability to source parts and the height of our ceilings. All our new lighting will be LED control lights with timers and remotes. It will also provide electricity savings and reduce the amount of maintenance required to keep the lighting functional. When completed, we will use $1 / 5$ the electricity on lighting and provide $\mathbf{2 0 \%}$ more light than our existing system. We also will be able to light the church more outside and provide a safer environment for our members.


We expect the project to take 13 days starting on November 3rd. We will have the worship service in the Fellowship Hall on November 9th.

We look forward to our new project and are glad that it will be just in time for the holiday season. We appreciate everyone who has helped in making this project possible and we hope to see the improvements soon.
