Grace and peace.

Somehow Holy Week and Easter are already showing up on our calendar this month! I really appreciate the worship that we have throughout Holy Week. Beginning on Palm Sunday, the week before Easter, we begin following the story of the Passion, of Jesus' entrance into Jerusalem through to his death and resurrection. It is a roller coaster of emotions, and an important one for us to ride as we wrestle with the incredible love of God witnessed to us in Christ.

On Palm Sunday we experience the jubilation of Jesus being welcomed as a king into Jerusalem. It is the celebration that many during his time wanted for him. a king to overthrow the oppressive powers of this world. It is ironic, perhaps, that the public celebration during Jesus' time came at the beginning of the week, with the reaction to his resurrection, at least initially, being more confusion than celebration.

On Maundy Thursday in worship we remember Jesus and his disciples during the Last Supper. We remember Jesus in the upper room, in fellowship with his closest friends and companions, knowing that his death was now imminent, and giving them the gift of Holy Communion. It is a precious moment, connecting God's salvation of the Jews in Egypt, as Jesus and the disciples celebrated the Jewish holiday of Passover, to the salvation we now experience because of Christ's sacrifice. In communion, a gift of grace given during the Last Supper, we still experience that promise of salvation and get to hold that promise in our hands. It is a wonderful gift, but also a night in which the coming crucifixion looms.

Good Friday brings us a long way from the celebration of Palm Sunday. The crowd that cheered Jesus' triumphant entry has turned on him. Good Friday is when we remember Christ's crucifixion. when the people he came to save call for the death of their savior. He is rejected on every level, by the chief priests of the temple, by the political powers, and by the common people. The sins of the world placed Jesus on the cross, and in worship on Good Friday we mourn the death of our Lord, and the part we have to play in

And then we come to Easter, the pinnacle not only of Holy Week, not only of the Church year, but really of all Creation. At Easter we celebrate that God is more powerful even than sin and death, forces that too often seem unshakeable. "Death and taxes." right? But God has defeated those in Christ, and we celebrate on Easter that there is nothing in this world that we should fear, because it is the love of that God has the final word.

Holy Week is a journey through Jesus' time in Jerusalem, filled with exuberant highs, and devastating lows. We mourn the sin and brokenness that leads Jesus to the cross, and dwell on our captivity to that same sinfulness. But in the midst of the anxiety of the week, as also with the anxiety of life, we remember that there is the Easter promise of the light of Christ casting out darkness.
