Our illustrious musician, Greg, and I recently sat down and quickly looked at the calendar for Advent dinners and worship. Every year it seems like it sneaks up on me, and all of a sudden the holidays are coming fast and hard.

It's a busy time of year, for the church and for everyone else it seems. Holidays are a combination of wonderful breaks in our normal routines when we spend time with our families and our church family in fellowship and worship, and also, for many folks, times of added chaos and anxiety on top of already chaotic and anxious lives. We get nostalgic for wonderful meals eaten among family and friends, for traditions kept when so many seem to fade. We also get anxious about presents to buy, travel schedules among heavy traffic, and for family dynamics that can be tricky. For many folks holidays are also a reminder of who is not around the table this year, whether because of people living far away, because of broken relationships, or because of sickness or death.

The life and community of the church echoes this same pattern of the approaching holidays as both a wonderful break in routine and also added anxiety in the midst of busy schedules. We remember those who have died and live in in Christ on All

Saints Sunday in November. We gather together for a Thanksgiving meal the Sunday before Thanksgiving Day and Wednesdays in Advent. We have special worship services like our *Hanging of the Greens*, Advent Wednesday worship, and of course our Christmas Eve services.

I urge you all, in the midst of busy schedules and anxious times, to come to fellowship with the community, a time when nothing is expected of you except to love and be loved by others. I urge you to take advantage of added worship opportunities, especially in the season of Advent, when in the midst of life's chaos we get a chance to stop, to spend time in prayer, in song, and receiving the promise of God's grace in the bread and wine of communion, and to be reoriented as we're sent back out into the world. This is a busy time of year, when we can get overwhelmed by all of the expectations on us, which is why it is all the more important for us to find our way to participate in community and worship in Christ, a place where we can be reminded that no matter what we are anxious about, that we are loved. valued, and cared for by our God who created, redeemed, and sustains us.
