

Grace and peace,

I am excited that this month we are starting a new year of Confirmation classes with youth at Holy Comforter. We continue to work with many of the other Lutheran churches in Gaston County as we teach and form youth in our Lutheran expression of the Christian faith. Many of our sister churches are in pastoral transition, so this is a wonderful way that we can be the Church together. In Confirmation we work to teach Luther's Small Catechism, what Luther believed to be what every good Christian should know, while also forming the kids in community with one another.

At the end of this month on Reformation Sunday, October 30th, we will celebrate Confirmation for those who have completed two years in our Confirmation program and who are ready to make that faith commitment. That is what Confirmation is, a faith commitment made by the youth. In infant baptisms, parents and sponsors, and well as the church, make promises to raise the child in the faith. In a sense, we promise to have faith for the child as we form them in their

own faith and pass on the faith given to us in the Spirit to them. Confirmation is a service of affirmation of baptism when these children take some ownership of their faith for themselves. That is why Confirmation has often been thought of as the time when children become adults in the church. For instance. confirmed members can vote in the business of the church. For this reason, confirmation is not a graduation, not a finishing of something, but rather a commitment to something, or rather a recommitment to our baptismal identity in Christ.

The classes that we teach for Confirmation are not classes we graduate from, but rather tools that children use in order to a faith discernment that this thing that we call church is something that they want for themselves. So I am excited as we start up these classes again this year, as we provide tools for the kids to use as they question and wrestle with their faith. And I am excited as we move toward celebrating Confirmation on Refor-Sunday, the mation anniversary of the Reformation, when these kids will affirm their baptismal identities in Christ and claim ownership of their faith.

Following the worship service on October 16th the Consecration Sunday Brunch will be held in the Fellowship Hall and catered by Peace and Hominy of Belmont.

The Stewardship Committee introduced a program last year called *New Consecration Sunday*. We had great results with the people who responded to the message. However, the message may not have been as clear for some folks, so let us explain a little clearer.

Consecration Sunday is NOT:

- ...the church requiring everyone pledge a specific dollar amount.
- ...the church creating a budget based on Estimate of Giving cards.
- ...the church assigning a percentage of your income toward tithing.

What Consecration Sunday *is* meant for is time to reflect on the grace God has shown you, the abundance of God's provision for you and your family, and how we can give thanks to God in offerings. This is a time of reflection on the year past while looking at how to live generously into the future.

It is often said, when you write something down, you hold yourself more accountable. **Sunday, October 16** is about applying that theory to the promise you make to return to God the bounty God has given, an offering of thanksgiving then used for the Kingdom of God.

Although *Estimate of Giving* cards are collected and read by the finance committee, it is done only to assess the success of this program - Is our message reaching members? Are we making an impact by helping guide your heart? Are we fostering good stewards? We encourage you to use Consecration Sunday as an opportunity to direct, or redirect, your heart, to engage the spiritual practice of giving offerings to God in thanksgiving.
