

Columbarium for Holy Comforter

Our centennial celebrations continue in the midst of summer heat. Throughout the year many folk have been reflecting upon the history of Holy Comforter over the last 100 years; the hopes, dreams, and visions of this congregational family working through the power of the Holy Spirit to share the Gospel of Jesus Christ to our community and world. In the first 50 years we witnessed growth from a tiny seed planted by less than 2 dozen charter members. By faith they founded what to this day is still the only Lutheran congregation in the North Carolina Synod that bears the name, "Holy Comforter."

Our current site location has been home now for more than half of our past century. The architecture was truly a marvel in design in the 1950's. By our 75th Anniversary the congregation took a bold leap when we installed our beautiful pipe organ, which has led us in songs of praise to God ever since. Today we once again engage in prayer and dialogue, asking God for direction in providing for our needs, and our neighbors. Conversations abound among individuals and committees regarding future expansion of ministry space. One part of vision plans involved the addition of a columbarium for the interment of ashes.

Recently Shirley Causby approached the congregational council with a generous gift in memory of her husband, Tommy, which would underwrite the construction cost of a columbarium on our church grounds. For years ashes have been scattered/interred on this site, but with no specific designated location. A member of our church, Mark Kline, gave

his time and talents to come up with a design that has since been approved by council, which will be built just out from the bell tower. We believe the design from Mark will compliment the church architecture well, as if it were part of the original plans for the church grounds.



The project will begin this month, and the current build will provide 192 "niches" in which ashes can be placed, with an ability to expand with future need. We will also include a memorial where the names on our current memorial will be placed, as well as names added of those who wish to place their ashes elsewhere on the grounds in the future. We continue to discern specific plans and policies surrounding the columbarium, and that information will be made known at a future time. We are delighted that this timely gift enables this project to be a part of our centennial year celebration.
