Grace and peace,

Since becoming a pastor, I have become more and more aware of the extent to which anxiety permeates the lives of people. It is something that has come up many times, often when the number of responsibilities and relationships that pull on them and make demands on them rise. But in the past year especially, it seems like peoples' anxieties have been high. I don't know if it is because of the political climate and the extreme tension in the country, a lack of sense of security, feeling like life has kept them off balance, or what. Anxiety can be a good thing, raising our awareness and senses when needed. But it seems that often the anxiety level does not match the things causing the stress in lives. When this comes with limited relief it leads to all kinds of lack of health, often most apparent in relationships with those around us, as well as in our levels of exhaustion and in our physical health.

As much as we think of the holiday season between Thanksgiving and Christmas in nostalgic ways, the reality is that it raises the anxiety level for many. The pressure to buy presents, bake cookies, appear like you have it together for Christmas parties, spend time with family that don't always have healthy or helpful expectations of you, and just the feeling like you have to be in eight places at once, can all build and mount and a joyful season turns into one that breaks us down and makes us feel inadequate and defeated.

Which brings us to Advent, the season of the church year in which much of this time falls. Often we view Advent as a count-

down to Christmas, and in a sense it is. Many of the familiar readings through Advent are Old Testament readings that speak of the coming Messiah, Jesus. But Advent is also a season that looks forward and proclaims Christ's second coming, when he will bring to fruition the healing of the world that was begun in the Incarnation. It is a season that looks at the world and names the reality that things are not as God desires them to be, and then offers hope in the promise that one day Christ will come and set things right, moved by love for all God has made.

I invite you all to come and worship with us, on Sundays, as well as on Wednesday nights in Advent, to hear the good news of hope and restoration as we await Christ's coming again, and invite someone you know that needs to hear this promise as well. To do so is to push back against the chaos, a claim that the narrative we hear that demands so much from us is not the only one offered us.

And whatever you do, remember that the coming season of Christmas reminds us that Christ remains present with us even in the waiting.
