Grace and peace,

So we have kicked off our Centennial year of celebrations that will include, among other things, tree plantings in Wittenberg, Germany and here as well, Lenoir-Rhyne choir visiting, monthly service projects, a historical display in the education building, and Bishop Tim joining us in December for our culminating celebration worship and banquet. It's an incredible thing to think about, that for 100 years we have gathered together for worship, for fellowship, and for service to our community in the name of Christ.

One of my seminary professors, who was one of the kindest people I have ever met, had a guiding question for us for times that were confusing, in crisis, momentous, or any other time to be honest. Instead of "What Would Jesus Do?". his question was "Where Is God In All This?" That has actually become a bit of a working definition for spirituality for me, the ability to recognize God's action in through, and around us. Spiritual growth often happens as we study the scriptural narrative of God's covenant relationship with all Creation, as we absorb the Church's traditions over the years as God's action, and as we pray for God to reveal God's self to us today. Recognizing God's action in, through, and around us allows us to rest assured that God remains faithful to God's people and to Creation, working grace and shining light into the darkness. There is often a sense of peace that comes with recognizing God's sovereignty when the world and our lives can seem chaotic. Recognizing God's action also allows us to join that action, as God calls us to work for and enact the kingdom

in our communities.

As we move through our centennial year, that's one question that I want us to keep asking as we celebrate 100 years of ministry. "Where Is God In All This?" Not only what have we done over the past 100 years in discipleship of Christ, but where has God been at work in through, and around us as The Lutheran Church of the Holy Comforter, and where is God at work now, and calling us to join in the kingdom work? In my two and a half years here I have seen God work to lift up the poor and vulnerable through work with SOCKS and the BCO, as well as funds you've donated which allow me to work with those who come to our door in need. I've seen God proclaim love for all people in the warmth and compassion you have for all who gather here. I've seen God through the way you've ministered to one another in times of grief and sorrow through meals, cards, kind words, and a ministry of presence. God is at work in, through, and around us, and I challenge you to think of the ways that is true for you as an individual, and for our congregation as a whole, as we celebrate 100 years of ministry together in Christ.
