Grace and peace,

One of the biggest challenges the church has faced across the millennia is that it is full of people. One church father posited that the church is a hospital for sinners, not a hotel for saints, and that has been a helpful reminder for me as I talk with folks about difficulties they have with others. No one is perfect, not the person frustrated, nor the one they're frustrated with. Within all of us is the ability to empathize with one another, to see others and both the joys and challenges that they face, and reach out to them in love. That looks different depending on who is involved and their particular gifts, but we all have the ability to do it in some way. But we also all have bad days, whether because we are sick, or anxious with something weighing heavy on us, or just got out of the wrong side of the bed. Sometimes we're not at our best, and we can step on someone's toes or someone can step on ours and we're less gracious than we might otherwise be. It happens. And we don't look like the "good Christians" people expect us to be when it does.

Just so you know, this is nothing new. Stories from the Book of Acts and a number of places throughout Paul's letters to early churches make it clear that from the time of the apostles the church has struggled with how being the church means we live together in community. In fact, one of Paul's most-quoted writings, 1 Corinthians 13 about love being patient, kind, not envious or boastful...is not about marriage, as it is often used, but in fact Paul was talking about what love looks like in Christian community. I think it is telling, for me, that Paul does not

talk about community in Christ as "perfect" in that we don't make mistakes. Paul doesn't say love is without err or misstep. Looking at it again, much of what Paul says about love could really apply most directly when someone has messed up, and what the reaction should be: patient, kind, not envious or boastful or arrogant or rude...

Often the secular world calls Christians hypocrites, because our actions all too often do not reflect our beliefs. In some ways they're right, though that whole conversation is one for another day. But I think that Christianity, particularly when lived out in community, is as much about forgiveness as it is about not making mistakes. A more vivid image of a Christian life is how we respond to the errs and missteps of others. Do we hold them over them? Use them to think ourselves better of them? Or do we respond graciously, working to empathize with where they are? Being the Church together, living together in Christian community, is as much or more about reconciliation as it is about perfection. It is working to bring healing and wholeness to relationships, and individuals through them.

Just for the record, I love our community here, and frequently give thanks to God for you all.

The Centennial Committee kicked off our Growing Together by Giving campaign in January to honor Holy Comforter's 100th anniversary. In addition to sharing God's love to others in the community, we were blessed to extend our love and outreach to Wittenberg, Germany! Holy Comforter was 1 of 500 worldwide churches selected to commemorate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation by participating in the Luthergarten landscaping project. Andreas Kipar, renowned landscape architect, designed Luthergarten with profound symbolism and reformation optimism. It has an overall oval shape containing 270 trees from all continents. Additionally, 230 trees will complete the surrounding areas so that there will be 500 trees altogether, symbolizing the 500 years of the Reformation. In the center of the garden the shape of a Luther Rose has been paved. In several areas the measurements of the grounds reflect the number 95, the number of Luther's theses.

On May 22, 2017, Pastor Hans Kauch of LWB project and his assistant, Annette Glaubig, greeted Tim and Debbie Baker at our tree site (#366). The ceremony included liturgical service, song and reflection of scripture, "I am the vine; you are the branches. If you remain in me and I in you, you will bear much fruit; apart from me you can do nothing" (John 15:5), which was selected by the Centennial Committee. During the ceremony it was disclosed the site was once occupied by Germany military. The Silver Linden tree was selected for it's unique "turning over a new leaf" symbolism of previous oppressive grounds. The Silver Linden is a shade tree featuring dark, radiant green leaves on top with shimmering silver beneath. In the extreme heat, the canopy appears to shimmer as the dark leaves turn over to the silver side to reflect the sun and conserve evaporation. The ceremony concluded with prayer, which was delivered in unison with our native languages.

As part of our sponsorship agreement, Holy Comforter will be planting a tree this fall on our grounds to celebrate our con-



nectedness to *Luthergarten*. Until then, please continue in partake in our monthly service projects, the 100 intentional acts of Kindness Tree located in the narthex, various special events and concluding with the banquet held December 10th, 2017 –100 years, nearly to the day, after we officially became The Lutheran Church of the Holy Comforter.
