Grace and peace,

It has been a weird few weeks of weather lately. Temperatures we are used to seeing in late March or April have been getting people outside in shorts and tshirts much more than we're used to for February. My family was invited for a boat ride on the lake in mid-February, something I'm sure I've never done before, and it was beautiful. Looking out my office window there are beautiful pink and red flowers in bloom, and it seems people's allergies are getting bad. We're used to these things happening in a month or two, but it seems Winter has gotten jealous of Spring, and much of the renewal and growth we're used to in Spring has already begun.

March 1 is the beginning of Lent, the 40 days that lead up to Easter, minus Sundays which are our "little Easters" that we celebrate each week. The season of Lent is often a more somber season where we hold a mirror to ourselves and think about how our lives need to change. Often we take part in a spiritual discipline to help us in this work, but it added scripture study, new prayer practices, or fasting (not talking about the diet you've been meaning to do anyway!). It is a time when we recognize we are not who God created and saved us to be, and so we repent, and turn again to God.

This process is not wholly a somber one, however. The word "Lent" originally came from the word for "Spring." Just as Spring is a time of renewal and growth, Lent is a time of renewal in our commitment to discipleship and growth as a Christian. And that is a good and joyful thing, something to celebrate, even. So ves, we should do the hard work of repentance, being honest with ourselves about our sinfulness. Ash Wednesday is a good reminder of our mortality and sinfulness, the starting point for our faith walk through Lent. And then we repent, we recommit, and we grow as Christians, daily remembering our baptisms and our dying and rising anew as beloved children of God

And so this weird weather and blooming seems like maybe a fitting prequel to the season of Lent, when our walk of faith invites us to blossom and grow as we turn again to the new life we have in Christ.
