Grace and peace,

It is a small but nice bit of affirmation when you and the presiding bishop of the ELCA have the same idea for a newsletter article. In the most recent edition of *Living Lutheran*, the ELCA's magazine, she wrote an article entitled, "Oct. 32." October 31 is the anniversary of the day in 1517 when Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses. "Oct. 32" refers to the idea that we are now done with our commemorating the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, so now what? I was going to entitle my article "500 +1." You can decide which is better.

Lutherans all over the world have spent the last year focusing on the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. There have been worship services commemorating it, from Gaston County, to a combined NC/SC synod service in Charlotte, to Bishop Eaton preaching in the National Cathedral, and Pope Francis worshiping with leaders of the Lutheran World Federation. It has been impressive how much work has gone into these celebrations and commemorations. And it has been good that we have done so. It is good to celebrate our history, to lift up the rich tradition of which we are a part, to

be proud of who we are, even while recognizing the places we have fallen short of our witness to the kingdom.

But now that the anniversary has past, we have to ask ourselves, "what now?" Now that we have spent a year looking back, what does moving forward look like? Lutherans have a rich and wonderful theology, one that Luther used to rediscover the grace of God for God's Creation, and especially for God's people. It is a grace that sets us free, free to not live in fear of death, in all it's many forms, to not live in fear that we aren't good enough, and free to then live out our joy and thanksgiving for the sake of the world. I believe a wonderful testament to that theology and to our Lutheran tradition would be for us. together with the discerning guidance of the Holy Spirit, to undergo a reformation of our own, a rediscovering not only of the grace that is for us and calls us, but of the grace that sets us free for the sake of the world and sends us out to be instruments of that grace for others.

My hope and intention is that we will commemorate year 500+1 with this very work of discerning how Luther's work to rediscover God's grace for the world is calling us to live out that grace as a congregation with one another, in Belmont, and for the world.

friends of Holy Comforter. These CDs are available in the coming weeks. Each family may pick up a CD after worship on Centennial Sunday, December 10.



Many folks have been reflecting on our centennial celebrations. I remember 25 years ago during the month of November when we were installing our new pipe organ. Decades in the making through dialog and pray-

er...two years from the signing of the contact until installation. We were then a congregation that had been debt free for more than 25 years, and were very comfortable with that. Our biggest fear was, "How are we going to pay for it?" I will never forget the Sunday that Pastor Mike stood before the assembly and said, "Please do not give any more to the organ campaign...it's paid for." Those were requests that we did not anticipate ever hearing, especially ahead of schedule; but, this demonstrated that we need not fear to move forward...to challenge ourselves, knowing that God provides.

There was a homemade video, grainy in quality, but now posted at the top of our videos on the church website. There you

can fast forward through scenes showing our Sanctuary transformed to accommodate an instrument which weighs 22,000 lbs. and contains 1883 pipes. We actually removed everything from the sanctuary in the summer of 1992 and pressure washed the interior of the building. Not many churches can make such a claim. The video also shows this organist playing the instrument in Indianapolis prior to shipping to Belmont by *Mayflower*. It was an amazing time.
