- Christian Ed meeting will be on February 20th at 7pm.



Grace and peace,

When Jenn and I first started dating, I hadn't caught on to the fact that her family excitedly celebrates any holiday they can. For example, a birthday in her family is really more of a birth month because of how they stretch out the celebrating. And with the cynical mind that I inherited from my father, I laid it on thick about how Valentine's Day was a made up Hallmark holiday (which isn't quite true, it possibly became recognized outside of the church beginning with Geoffrey Chaucer), and that one day set aside for romantic love seemed forced. Not the best move for our first Valentine's Day together, I know. I was never "smooth." Thankfully her mother's response when she heard this was to buy me a pair of pajama pants with red hearts all over them. And even more thankfully, Jenn didn't drop me on the spot.

This year the seasons of Lent and Easter both begin on dates popularly recognized for other reasons. Easter Sunday is also April Fools, while Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, falls on Valentine's Day. Both seem strangely appropriate. Easter, for obvious reasons. "April Fools!" seems like a much less pious way for Jesus to have announced his resurrection. Ash Wednesday falling on Valentine's Day seems a bit less natural of a fit, but we can get there.

At the surface Ash Wednesday is as far from Valentine's Day as you can get. It is a day when we ponder our mortality, our sinfulness, and our need to repent and turn to God. It leads into the season of Lent, a season of reflection of our fallen nature, that we are not fully living the kingdom lives of discipleship and joy in the Spirit that God desires for us. It is a somber time, for sure. Also not lost on me is that the season of fasting, when a lot of people give up sweets, begins on the holiday when husbands regularly give chocolates to their wives. That just seems cruel.

The flip side is that God is always ready to receive our repentance, waiting with open arms for us to turn towards God. And it is the greatest act of **love** that opened our eyes to the extent to which God yearns for our repentance. When we were unable to make that move on our own, God sent God's Son into the world in mortal flesh to proclaim God's kingdom to the world, and then to die on the cross so that Sin no longer separates us from God.

So it seems weird, and we're jumping ahead in the Lenten narrative, I know, but as we receive the cross of ashes on our foreheads, and hear the somber words, "remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return," we also remember that as we do we are held safely in the unconditionally loving arms of God, given room to wrestle with our sinfulness, our brokenness, and our doubt. All of that is because of the greatest love we will ever know. Which seems right to remember on Valentine's Day.
