

Last week, Pastor Micah and I took Bella, Arden, and Tyler to confirmation camp at Lutheridge. This

week always teaches me so much. The first thing I learned is that sometimes I am more embarrassing than cool. Bella gently reminded me that sometimes my goofy and funny personality can be over the top. (Not that any of the other youth would agree.) The second thing I learned is that I have no clue what is popular amongst middle and high schoolers; I learned that the slang words I used at their age have the same meaning as the slang words they used today. The third thing I learned is that there is a small group of young people that think the Dukes of Hazard's are cooler than Beyoncé, which truthfully blew my mind. The last thing that I learned that blew my mind was how curious and absorbent our kids were when we discussed Bible studies and "why we do what we do".

The materials we use are based on the seasons of the church year, Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. On our Lent day we talked about the significance of the Cross. We watched a video where Nadia Bolz-Weber talked about our different views of it, and the different ways they look. That 7-minute video sparked so many different questions and ideas. Our young people are asking questions and thinking on ideas that both Micah and I said we wrestle with too. I feel like we spend so much time trying to find age appropriate things to expose our kids to. I feel like in the society we live in that, that is so important. I felt like this video was a bit thick to swim through, but I was truly in awe of how our young people are attempting to wrestle and wade through the sticky things in their faith.

On Friday we had a conversation about what confirmation is, and how all week long they have been living into what this step is. I am so proud of our young people taking this step in faith, for being curious and asking questions, but most importantly for being present and showing up for their faith and themselves. Ultimately, that what our faith is, even for us adults.



Grace and peace,

Fairly often I hear it said that religion and politics should stay separate from one another. And I understand that desire, especially these days. Politics are divisive, often drawing lines in order to establish who "the other" is, and especially these days, politics points fingers of blame at whoever is that "other." There is a reason politics aren't brought up much with my extended family during holiday meals together, because we've learned we get along much better if we don't talk about it. People, including me, want and expect their places and communities of faith to be peaceful places, working to reconcile the divisions made in other areas of society. The easiest way to have that is to do what my extended family does; don't talk about it, and keep politics and their faith separate.

But the fact of the matter is if our faith is anything to us beyond worship on Sunday mornings, faith and politics cannot be separate, because our faith sends us out into the world to be people who live out that faith. As the body of Christ in the world, Jesus calls us to feed the hungry, heal the sick, and welcome the stranger. His work doing the same made him an adversary of people in both religious and political power of his time. As we strive to do be the body of Christ, we will have conversations that include the political as we try to figure out what living out our call to discipleship looks like. It might look like advocacy if we see people who are op-

pressed or devalued. Feeding the hungry will require conversations about who we give to, whether someone must "deserve it," and whether our methods are responsible, and these conversations will sound political. When we talk about how to offer healing, part of that conversation will include whether or not that means healthcare should be available to everyone or only those who can afford it, or what kind of healthcare is included in that. When Jesus calls us to welcome the stranger, the political conversation becomes about whether this is means only Christians, only people who look like us, or only people who are here legally.

As a community of faith, we cannot avoid the conversation, but instead should be a place where we can have these conversations as a community founded in our faith and mutual love for one another, recognizing that we are bound to one another in the Spirit. We may not arrive at the same conclusions about what is a faithful witness, but we must not avoid conversations as we work to faithfully live out our discipleship as Christ's body in the world today. We should not let our political climate silence our Christian witness.
