Grace and peace,

We're not the only game in town anymore.

In years past the society in which we lived made room for church. Nothing was scheduled on Sunday mornings, and often not Wednesday nights either. The patterns of not only families' lives but also society in general made it so going to church was the path of least resistance. When folks moved into town the question wasn't whether they were going to join a church, but where.

That is no longer the world in which we live. Now we have choices. Lots of choices. There are sports, and band trips, 5K races or triathlons, vacations to relax from stress, travel for work or for fun, jobs that keep us working on Sundays, and a plethora of other things. And the thing is, none of these things I named are bad things. It is good to have hobbies, to be active, to have a job and also time to relax from one. It just means that after decades or centuries of society naturally making room for our faith, we now have to choose to do so ourselves. We have to want to show up and take part in worship and community, to wrestle with and grow in our faith. We have to work to create these patterns in our children, sometimes "forcing" them to come and be a part of lives and communities of faith instead of all of the other options open to them, believing it will create a foundation that will connect them to Christ throughout their lives.

Because while all of those other things are good, and in fact I believe God is very much alive, active, and working in all of those places, what we do here is different. It is here where we come together as a community of believers to worship God together. It is in worship where we confess our sins, the things which weigh heavy on us, and then hear God's word of grace and forgiveness poured out upon us, washing us clean. In worship we hear the word of God, the Good News of God's love and redemption of the world in Christ Jesus, read in scripture and then proclaimed both in a sermon and the music we make together. It is in worship where we take part in the sacraments, where we welcome new members of the Body of Christ in baptism, and hold in our hands and partake of Christ's body and blood, the tangible promise of forgiveness of sins and everlasting life. It is here where we are reoriented so that as we engage in all those wonderful options we have in our lives, we do so discerning how God is calling us to love and care for our neighbor and the world God made as we do.

core of voices to support good congregational singing. On these occasions we would like to create a data base of folks who would be willing to be "strength in numbers." You do not have to be a choir member, nor read music...only possess the ability to minister to those who are suffering from the loss of a loved one. Folks who may be challenged by height may sit on the back row of the balcony. More to follow about this in the coming months.
