 up for 40 days. As a kid, I always thought of the thing that I could give up that wouldn't be that hard because I had no clue why we had to give things up. So, one year I gave up chocolate milk, my Dad had given up all candy and I thought I would pick something like that and we could do it together. What actually happened is I didn't drink chocolate milk whenever my Dad was around because I didn't want him to know that I didn't succeed and because chocolate milk is delicious. Clearly, I had no clue what it meant to give up something for Lent.
"Growing deeper to grow wider", this quote sits on my desk and it is a gentle reminder that when things are tough it's for a good reason. I feel like this quote is applicable to most situations. I feel especially close to these words as we are in the midst of a busy season at church. This year I wanted to intentionally give something up that I would notice is missing. I gave up sweets this year, and I have definitely noticed. I have spent so much time explaining to our young people why some people choose to give something up for Lent that I needed this year to actually make me think and reflect on the sacrifice made for us. When I am craving one of Debbie Neagle's delicious cupcakes instead of delighting that sweet glory, I
have chosen to pray. The idea here is to spend more time with God. I think this is what that short and sweet quote is pushing me to. This is the growing deeper part, the growing wider is natural beyond this point. What are you and your families doing during this Lenten journey to grow deeper to stretch wider?

Grace and peace,
During the season of Lent, a season focused on our need for repentance, we spend time thinking about the sins in which we take part. While it is not all encompassing, an obvious place to start in this work is the Ten Commandments, God's basic guidelines for how to live in relationship with God and with our neighbor. While the commandments tend to be, at least superficially, simple and framed in the negative or, "thou shalt not," Luther's explanation of them expands on them and provides much deeper understanding of expectations of how we live in community.

Recently the commandments that I have been thinking about in this way are the $5^{\text {th }}$ and $8^{\text {th }}$ commandments, the commandments not to kill and not to bear false witness. Living in community is hard, to be sure. We are constantly dealing not only with the "saint" in one another, but also the "sinner." In other words, we don't always deal with the best versions of one another. In fact, sometimes it seems like our church family is the place where people feel most safe to show their backsides. While I hope that the simple, "Thou shalt not kill" would be obvious in these situations, and wouldn't be too hard to live by, Lu-
ther's explanation of these two commandments provide a greater challenge for us.

Of the $5^{\text {th }}$ commandment Luther says that along with not killing or harming our neighbor, we are also meant to "help and support them in all of life's needs." Of the $8^{\text {th }}$ Luther says of our neighbors that "we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light." This is immensely harder than simply not murdering or lying, because it means not only should we not cause harm, either by our words or actions, but that following God's commandments means we are meant to assume the best of people and their intentions, defend them when people speak ill of them, and do whatever we can to work for their good.

And there is no caveat. The commandments don't say we are off the hook if the people don't reciprocate, but that even when people cause us harm, our call as God's children is to continue to assume the best of others, speak well of them, and work for their good. May this season of Lent be a time of repentance not away from the harm we do to ourselves and others, but toward the life-giving good God calls us to in grace-filled community with one another.
