Grace and peace,

When I was in seminary they beat us over the head with the idea of "self-care." In terms of the job what that largely meant was we were to draw healthy boundaries with our work so that we aren't becoming workaholics and we leave time for our families and our own health and well-being. The Church had recognized that there were generations of pastors who were burnt out from overworking, had unhealthy family dynamics, and whose insurance premiums were abnormally high because pastors, on average, are middleaged, overweight, and stressed and at risk for heart disease.

The truth is. I think our culture at large is pretty bad at self-care. Whether we are working and feel pressure to work harder and longer hours, whether we are parenting and feel like every waking hour must be lived for our kids, or we have tons of free time but don't use it effectively, we often spend our time in ways that are not mindful of our own health. Portico Health Benefist, which provides insurance for many rostered leaders of the ELCA, has a version of the wellness wheel, a tool used to evaluate how we attend to our personal well-being. At the center is our baptismal identity, that we are a new creation in Christ and that God desires for us to have abundant life centered in Christ. Around that center are the areas of well-being entitled, "Social/Interpersonal, emotional, physical, financial, vocational, and intellectual," with "spiritual" encircling all of these.

The idea is that it takes being attentive to all of these areas to live a wellrounded and healthy life. Most of us don't do all of these well, I certainly don't. Lord knows the last time I was in a gym. And often when I think about taking time to pay attention to my health I feel guilty for choosing to spend more time away from my family than I already am. However, when we pay attention to these things, we are better equipped to be servants of others. Think of it as a pitcher of water. If we are constantly emptying ourselves, be it for work or even caring for others, eventually we run empty, which is when we become stressed and are not at our best, lashing out in relationships, slacking in our work, or struggling with anxiety or depression. But if we take time for self-care, to be filled, then we are equipped for lives of service for others. I encourage you all to think through these areas of your life and maybe iust choose one for now that could use some intentionality. Even google "Portico wellness wheel" and give it a look.

Life these days is hectic and chaotic, and there are so many things pulling on us and calling for our time and attention. May we be a community that supports and encourages health and well-being for one another.
