
Beka's Buzz In three years at Holy C there aren't many firsts for me these days. Recently Pastor Micah, Greg, Dianne and my-





Vaccines are arguably one of the greatest technological developments of the twentieth century. They've done such a good job preventing and eradicating disease that many Americans have never seen a case of the mass killers of the past, such as smallpox and polio. However, despite their success, more than 40,000 American adults die each year from diseases that can be prevented by immunization. Check out these statistics:

- As we age, we become more susceptible to serious diseases caused by common infections, such as influenza and pneumococcal (strep) pneumonia.
- Nearly 1 million Americans get "shingles" (herpes zoster) every year.
- By age 50, 80% of all women will be infected with human papillomavirus (HPV), the virus that causes cervical cancer.

- Pertussis (whooping cough) is on the rise and can be life-threatening to babies and NON-IMMUNIZED ADULTS.
- ◆ 36,000 Americans die each year from flurelated illness; most of these are 65 years of age or older.

Current recommendations for adult immunizations are as follows:

Flu (influenza) vaccine. To prevent the flu, the CDC recommends annual flu vaccination for everyone ages 6 months or older. Adults age 50 and older should not get the nasal spray flu vaccine. The flu can cause serious complications in older adults.

Pneumococcal vaccine.

The CDC recommends the pneumococcal vaccines — there are two — for adults age 65 and older.

- Tetanus toxoid, reduced diphtheria toxoid and acellular pertussis (Tdap) vaccine. One dose of Tdap is routinely given at age 11 or 12. If you've never had a Tdap vaccine, the CDC recommends getting the Tdap vaccine as soon as possible. One dose of Tdap vaccine is also recommended during each pregnancy, ideally between week 27 and 36 of pregnancy. A Td booster is recommended every 10 years.
- Shingles. To prevent shingles, the CDC recommends the vaccine Shingrix for healthy adults age 50 and older, even if you've previously had the live shingles vaccine, Zostavax. While not life-threatening, shingles can be very painful.
- Human papillomavirus (HPV): Women ages 19-26 should receive 3 doses of vaccine.

So, while getting your children's vaccinations up-to-date, be sure to get YOURS up-to-date, as well. You'll be a good role model for them!


