September - "Back to Schoo month" - is already upon us! What a hot summer we've had and I know most of you are really looking forward to fall

The Walk With God program has been underway all summer and now coming to a close for the season (we made it to the West Coast and back home!), but the Health Ministry has a few things up its sleeves for you for the fall and winter: We are working on putting together a workshop called "Getting Your House in Order," a seminar on dementia versus Alzheimer's, and the PEP exercise class (remember, it's the one that is gentle exercise for folks with joint mobility issues) will resume soon for the school year.

Now, with school starting we think about the need for our kiddos to be up-to-date on their immunizations, but there is need for adults to be up-to-date, also. Consider this:

Vaccines are arguably one of the greates technological developments of the twentieth century. They've done such a good job preventing and eradicating disease that many Americans have never seen a case of the mass killers of the past, such as smallipox and polio. However, despite their success year from diseases that can be prevented by immunization. Check out these statistics:

- As we age, we become more susceptible to serious diseases caused by common infections, such as influenza and pneumococcal (strep) pneumonia.
- Nearly 1 million Americans get "shingles" (herpes zoster) every year.
By age 50, $80 \%$ of all women will be in fected with human papillomavirus (HPV), the virus that causes cervical cancer.

Pertussis (whooping cough) is on the rise and can be life-threatening to babies and NON-IMMUNIZED ADULTS
36,000 Americans die each year from flurelated illness; most of these are 65 years of age or older.

Current recommendations for adult immunizations are as follows

Flu (influenza) vaccine. To prevent the flu the CDC recommends annual flu vac cination for everyone ages 6 months or older. Adults age 50 and older should not get the nasal spray flu vaccine. The flu can cause serious complications in older adults.
Pneumococcal vaccine
The CDC recommends the pneumococcal vaccines - there are two - for adults age 65 and older
Tetanus toxoid, reduced diphtheria toxoid and acellular pertussis (Tdap) vaccine. One dose of Tdap is routinely given at age 11 or 12. If you've never had a Tdap vaccine, the CDC recommends getting the Tdap vaccine as soon as possible. One dose of Tdap vaccine is also recommended during each pregnancy, ideally between week 27 and 36 of pregnancy. A Td booster is recommended every 10 years.
Shingles. To prevent shingles, the CDC recommends the vaccine Shingrix for healthy adults age 50 and older, even if you've previously had the live shingles vaccine, Zostavax. While not life-threatening, shingles can be very painful.
Human papillomavirus (HPV): Women ages 19-26 should receive 3 doses of vaccine.

So, while getting your children's vaccinations up-to-date, be sure to get YOURS up-to-date as well. You'll be a good role model for them!


Our children's ensemble will
begin again on Rally Day (September 8) at 8:45. We will have a brief session before our fellowship breakfast at 9:00 on that day. This group thereafter meets Sundays $8: 45-9: 30$, moving directly into Sunday school. All of the ringers also sing in our choral choir.Youth Handbell Ensemble is a group of youth who come together to ring seasonally, accompanying both Advent and Lenten Evening services of worship. A signup sheet will begin circulating in September in preparation for Advent services

We usually rehearse beginning a month or so out from these services of worship. Conact Greg if you have any questions. You do not have to read music in order to participate. We have space for up to 12 ringers.

Several teenagers have expressed interest in participating in the formation of a Youth Choir Ensemble for middle and high schoolers. In the past, scheduling young folks busy schedules proved to be an obstacle not easily overcome.

We are again in conversation regarding how this ministry might be renewed. So, youth, let your voices be heard! Let Greg know of your interest. If the numbers do not yet exist another option is participation in the church choir which is open through audition to members of confirmation age and over.
