Dinner Church


The 5th Wednesday of August @ 6:30pm

Holy Comforter's operating deficit (expenses in excess of offering income) during June was \$7505.11. Total giving to support Holy Comforter's routine expenses for the month was \$19,151.00. The budget estimate of the amount needed each month in 2023 is \$28,901.58. The year-to-date deficit, through June 30, was \$38,088.49. Year-to-date spending was \$4,062.01 below the amount planned in the 2023 budget. The foregoing table provides additional perspective and comparisons with offering income, expenses and budgets in prior years.

Grace and Peace,

In late June I got back from a six week sabbatical, time away from my work at Holy Comforter to rest. To be clear, I am not the only person that deserves this kind of time to rest, but I appreciate the gift the congregation gave to allow me to have it.

The sabbatical started with Jenn and I spending a week in Ireland, focusing on cultural experiences, environmental sight-seeing, and spiritual experiences. It did not disappoint. My favorite region was Connemara, particularly the national park in which we hiked (I still owe Jenn for making her hike on top of a mountain in the wind and rain). My favorite city was Dingle, a seaside city rich in culture, music, food, and charm. My favorite place all-together was likely Inis Mor, an island not far from Galway that was a hub for Celtic Monasticism. It was a "thin place," a place where it seems the veil of between our awareness of this world and the divine seems to grow thin. It was beautiful in its barrenness, and the spirituality that existed there for centuries still lends a mystique to the place that I felt engaging. I quickly fell in love with Ireland, with the beauty of the land, with the hospitality of the people, and with aspects of their spiritual traditions.

The end of the sabbatical included a trip to Italy with the whole family, including my parents and my sister's family. We spent three days in Rome, and while it was exciting to see so many historical sights, both religious and secular, and experience the culture of a city like Rome, the most fun was watching our boys engage it, be excited about new experiences, be enthralled by places like the Vatican, and art like Michelangelo's "Pieta." From there we took a train to Puglia, a region on the east coast of Italy, and slowed down a good bit, exploring during the day and spending hours at a villa eating and spending time with my family.

Both trips were incredible, and I hope it was not the last time I'll go to either country, but I think the gift I didn't expect was how I was able to be fully present with and for my family in between those trips. As the boys finished school I was at each party and award presentation. As summer began I was there through the day to play sports with Nathaniel, watch Gabriel create stop-motion animations, help in the garden, and build another chicken coop on a whim. I have never been able to be that present for that amount of time, and I will cherish that so much, especially with the boys at ages where they still want to hang out with me!

And now I'm glad to be back at work and with you all. I missed you all, and it was hard not having updates on so many folks and how they were doing with health or life situations. I am excited to get back to work planning and being a part of ministry in Christ's name with you all. After 9 years of serving here, I still feel called to Holy Comforter, to the people here, to the ministry we are a part of together, and I look forward to where the Spirit will lead us from here!
