Grace and peace,

If you've been around here for a little while, you've heard me talk about the "already, but not yet" aspect of the kingdom of God. It's the idea that in the life. death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. God ushered God's kingdom into the world; that in Christ's victory over sin and death and turning the world on its head, the kingdom of God is here in a very real way, showing us what the life God desires for us looks like. lives of love shared between us and God and us and our neighbors.

As we approach the season of Advent, I often think of it as the season that encapsulates that "already but not yet" aspect of the kingdom. We read scripture about how God prepared the world for Jesus' birth more than two thousand years ago, stories that include John the Baptist proclaiming in the wilderness to prepare the way of the Lord, or stories like Elizabeth and Mary rejoicing over their pregnancies, and John "jumping for joy" in Mary's womb in the presence of prenatal Christ. We remember the anticipation leading up to Christ's birth. And now, all these years after Christ's ministry ushering in God's kingdom, we still wait with anticipation for Christ's coming again. We await the time when God's kingdom takes hold not just in certain times and places, but in all times and places, and in the hearts and minds of all people.

2016 has been a tumultuous year in our country and around the world. Wars have ravaged countries so that people run to the uncertainty of life as refugees over the danger of their homes, our country has been divided over issues of race, violence by and against police, and partisan politics. (And of course let's not forget the death of Prince and David Bowie!) Not to mention the challenges in our own personal lives, of which there have been many for folks in our congregation, be it health issues, family situations, or anxiety of work.

In the wake of such a year, Advent for us is a time when we can have our hope restored. As we live in the "already but not vet" time between Christ's birth and coming again, we recognize that God's kingdom is in fact present in the world and in our lives, working grace and peace in the midst of these hard times. And we find comfort in the promise that even while we lament it, the turmoil of the world will not last forever, and that we have the promise that Christ will come again and set all things right.

However, it also calls us back from complacency, if that is our tendency. Christ's kingdom is at hand, and at hand in us, the Church. We have work to do. And Christ is coming back again, and we shouldn't be caught unawares.


