







Sciatica! WHAT is it? You hear folks speak of this ailment all the time, "my sciatica is acting up," or "I've got sciatica." But what, exactly IS it? The sciatica nerves are the longest nerves in the body. They exit your lower spine and group together in the pelvis, and then split off into two branches, with a branch running down the back of each buttock, leg and into the foot. When one of these nerves becomes inflamed, the condition is called sciatica. Symptoms include pain radiating from the lower back into the buttock and down the back or outside of the leg. The pain can come on suddenly, like a lightning bolt, or it can present itself as

a dull, nagging toothache type of pain. The good news is...sciatica IS treatable. If you experience this type of pain, first try resting your back and, if your doctor allows it, use a non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drug for a few days to see if it relieves it. If not, then call your doctor. He/she will be able to provide you with proper treatment.


