

Silence for reflection.


P To you, O God,







FIRST READING Jeremiah 33:14-16

A reading from the thirty-third chapter of Jeremiah.

In the Old Testament, "righteousness" often has to do with being faithful in relationship. God acts righteously both in punishing Israel for its sin and in having mercy. In today's reading, Jerusalem's future name—"The Lord is our righteousness"—proclaims that the Lord is even now working salvation for Israel.

¹⁴The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will fulfill the promise I made to the house of Israel and the house of Judah. ¹⁵In those days and at that time I will cause a righteous Branch to spring up for David; and he shall execute justice and righteousness in the land. ¹⁶In those days Judah will be saved and Jerusalem will live in safety. And this is the name by which it will be called: "The LORD is our righteousness."

1 Thessalonians 3:9-13

A reading from the third chapter of 1 Thessalonians.

Upon Timothy's report from the congregation at Thessalonica, Paul is exuberant with gratitude for them. In this passage from his letter, Paul voices overflowing thanks, joy, and blessings for the people of this growing church.

⁹How can we thank God enough for you in return for all the joy that we feel before our God because of you? ¹⁰Night and day we pray most earnestly that we may see you face to face and restore whatever is lacking in your faith.

¹¹Now may our God and Father himself and our Lord Jesus direct our way to you. ¹²And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love for one another and for all, just as we abound in love for you. ¹³And may he so strengthen your hearts in holiness that you may be blameless before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all his saints.

²⁹Then he told them a parable: "Look at the fig tree and all the trees; ³⁰as soon as they sprout leaves you can see for yourselves and know that summer is already near. ³¹So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that the kingdom of God is near.

³²Truly I tell you, this generation will not pass away until all things have taken place.

³³Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away.

³⁴"Be on guard so that your hearts are not weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and the worries of this life, and that day does not catch you unexpectedly, ³⁵like a trap. For it will come upon all who live on the face of the whole earth. ³⁶Be alert at all times, praying that you may have the strength to escape all these things that will take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."



Do you have high blood pressure (hypertension)? Definition of high blood pressure...systolic (top number) of 140 or greater OR diastolic (bottom number) of 90 or greater. If not – good! But listen to these statistics from the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute (NHLBI): "Fifty million adults in the U.S. have high blood pressure." Furthermore,

data from NHLBI's landmark study suggest that middle-aged and elderly individuals face a 90% risk of developing hypertension during their remaining years! Also, studies have shown that a reduction in systolic blood pressure of as little 2 mmHg could save more than 70,000 lives. What can you do? Change your lifestyle! Get an adequate intake of potassium, **eat a well-balanced diet** of fruits, vegetables, and low-fat dairy products and reduce your intake of saturated fat. Limit consumption of sodium and alcohol, **reduce excess body weight**, and **increase activity**. The National High Blood Pressure Education Program states that "if every adult American lowered his/her average systolic blood pressure by 5 mmHg, we'd see a 14% drop in deaths from stroke, a 9% drop in heart disease deaths, and a 7% drop in overall mortality." So, let's go! Eat healthy, watch your weight, and exercise, exercise, exercise! Even exercising 15 minutes a day 3-4 times a week, makes a huge difference! Take care of yourselves!
