



2 Thessalonians 3:6-13


A reading from the third chapter of 2 Thessalonians.

The Thessalonian community is facing disagreements about the end-times and what to do in the meantime. This portion of the letter addresses the need to keep working, to hold to the teachings they had received, and to not grow weary in doing what is right.

⁶Now we command you, beloved, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, to keep away from believers who are living in idleness and not according to the tradition that they received from us. ⁷For you yourselves know how you ought to imitate us; we were not idle when we were with you, ⁸and we did not eat anyone's bread without paying for it; but with toil and labor we worked night and day, so that we might not burden any of you. ⁹This was not because we do not have that right, but in order to give you an example to imitate. ¹⁰For even when we were with you, we gave you this command: Anyone unwilling to work should not eat. ¹¹For we hear that some of you are living in idleness, mere busybodies, not doing any work. ¹²Now such persons we command and exhort in the Lord Jesus Christ to do their work quietly and to earn their own living. ¹³Brothers and sisters, do not be weary in doing what is right.

¹²"But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. ¹³This will give you an opportunity to testify. ¹⁴So make up your minds not to prepare your defense in advance; ¹⁵for I will give you words and a wisdom that none of your opponents will be able to withstand or contradict. ¹⁶You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. ¹⁷You will be hated by all because of my name. ¹⁸But not a hair of your head will perish. ¹⁹By your endurance you will gain your souls."

Get Me a Human!! Don't you just hate it when you're trying to call someone and have to go through numerous levels of "options" before you finally – if you're lucky – get to the correct person? Do you find your temper rising as you go through this process or do you just give up and never actually get to that destination? Well now there is help! In order to bypass the options and the automated responses, and actually speak with a human, consult the Get2Human database of secret phone numbers and codes that immediately get an actual, live person on the line for customer service for more than 1000 major companies. It's wonderful! Just check out www.get2human.com. It

will take you to a database of over 1000 major companies and tells you how to bypass all those tiring options! Or you can check out another database that will give you the menu options BEFORE you make the call, so you'll know which option to immediately choose and not have to wait. And they give these tips for rapid connection for companies NOT on their site: 1. Interrupt – press 0 or #0 or 0# or *0 repeatedly. Many automated systems will connect to a human after numerous invalid entries. 2. Talk – Say "get human," raise your voice, or mumble. Sometimes the automated system will connect to a human after things it can't identify. 3. Hold – just hold, pretending you have an old rotary phone. 4. Select Spanish - sometimes selecting Spanish will get you to a bilingual human more quickly than waiting for an English-only operator.

THIS is a "de-stress" message from your Parish Nurse! Take a deep breath and try these techniques next time you have a call to make that you know will require a LOT of patience!


