Arising during times of great persecution, apocalyptic literature is concerned with God's revelation about the end time and the coming kingdom of God, when God will vindicate the righteous who have been persecuted.

SECOND READING

Hebrews 10:11-25

A reading from the tenth chapter of Hebrews.

Images of worship and sacrifice are used throughout Hebrews to highlight what Christ has uniquely accomplished through his death. Because we have received forgiveness through Christ's death, we live with sincere hearts by trusting in God's promises and encouraging love and good works from each other.

¹¹Every priest stands day after day at his service, offering again and again the same sacrifices that can never take away sins. ¹²But when Christ had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, "he sat down at the right hand of God," ¹³and since then has been waiting "until his enemies would be made a footstool for his feet." ¹⁴For by a single offering he has perfected for all time those who are sanctified. ¹⁵And the Holy Spirit also testifies to us, for after saying,

16"This is the covenant that I will make with them after those days, says the Lord:
I will put my laws in their hearts,
and I will write them on their minds,"

17he also adds.

"I will remember their sins and their lawless deeds no more."

¹⁸Where there is forgiveness of these, there is no longer any offering for sin.

¹⁹Therefore, my friends, since we have confidence to enter the sanctuary by the blood of Jesus, ²⁰by the new and living way that he opened for us through the curtain (that is, through his flesh), ²¹and since we have a great priest over the house of God, ²²let us approach with a true heart in full assurance of faith, with our hearts sprinkled clean from an evil conscience and our bodies washed with pure water. ²³Let us hold fast to the confession of our hope without wavering, for he who has promised is faithful. ²⁴And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, ²⁵not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.

This is but the beginning of the birth pangs."



I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.





Did you know that 70% - 80% of all illness is stress related?

What happens when we are **stressed**? Our breathing, heart rate and blood pressure increase to send more oxygen into our systems. Circulation reroutes itself from the digestive tract and extremities into the large muscles and brain. Our fat and sugar reserves pour into the

bloodstream to provide quick energy. Blood-clotting elements enter the bloodstream to prepare the body to defend against injury. Digestion stops, muscles tense, perspiration increases, our senses become more acute.

How does this translate into recognizable signs? We experience a tightening in the stomach or chest; clenching of jaws and gritting of teeth; tensing of muscles; rapid breathing; rapid and pounding pulse; cold, clammy hands; tightness in the throat.

What can we do about it? Next time you become aware that you are getting tense, try these techniques: SIGHING – Take a long, slow sigh, and another, and another, until you feel the tension begin to release. HUMMING – The vibration of humming is relaxing. Try humming steadily while you exhale. Repeat the exercise until you feel the release of tension. PROGRESSIVE RELAXATION – Sit in a relaxed position or lie down. Starting with your heels, tighten the muscles in the back of your heels, hold for a count of 8, then release. Working your way up from your heels, follow that same technique of tense and release for each muscle group in your legs, buttocks, abdomen, hands, arms, shoulders, and neck. MUSIC – even at work, soothing music will ease tension. Environmental sounds such as rain, birds, surf, or other natural sounds are particularly helpful.

DON'T LET STRESS MAKE YOU ILL! Practice these techniques and minimize the effect stress has on your body and mind.
