Writing to Christians in Philippi, Paul admits that his heritage and reputation could give him more reason than most people to place confidence in his spiritual pedigree. But the overwhelming grace of God in Jesus calls Paul to a new set of values.

[Paul writes:] ^{4b}If anyone else has reason to be confident in the flesh, I have more:

⁵circumcised on the eighth day, a member of the people of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; as to the law, a Pharisee; ⁶as to zeal, a persecutor of the church; as to righteousness under the law, blameless.

⁷Yet whatever gains I had, these I have come to regard as loss because of Christ.

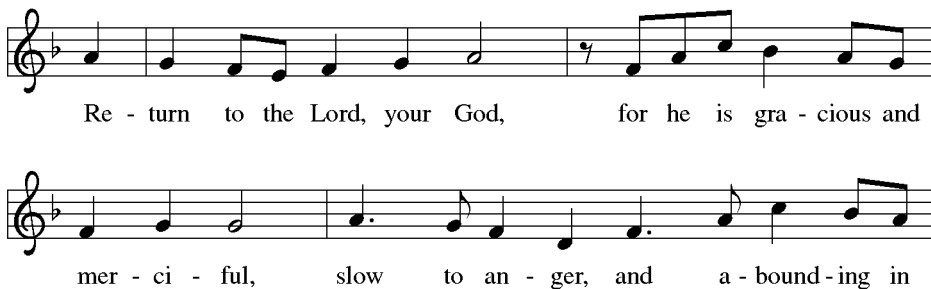
⁸More than that, I regard everything as loss because of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things, and I regard them as rubbish, in order that I may gain Christ ⁹and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but one that comes through faith in Christ, the righteousness from God based on faith. ¹⁰I want to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and the sharing of his sufferings by becoming like him in his death, ¹¹if somehow I may attain the resurrection from the dead.

¹²Not that I have already obtained this or have already reached the goal; but I press on to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. ¹³Beloved, I do not consider that I have made it my own; but this one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, ¹⁴I press on toward the goal for the prize of the heavenly call of God in Christ Jesus.

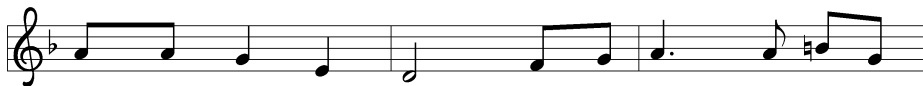

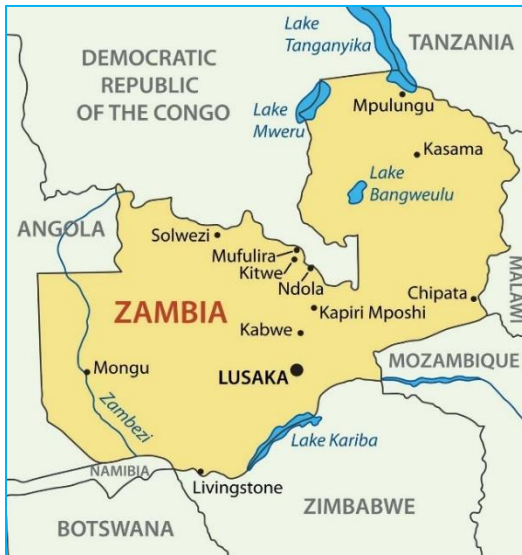

Supercharge Your Diet! Many nutrients actually have a synergistic effect – working better in combos. And what’s terrific is that the foods that contain these nutrients tend to taste great together, so try the following:

Broccoli + Salmon = stronger bones. The body can’t form calcitriol – a hormone that helps calcium absorption – without vitamin D. Pair calcium-rich broccoli with vitamin D-rich salmon.

Green tea + Lemon = Reduced inflammation. Adding lemon juice to a cup of green tea helps the body take in up to five times more catechins – inflammation-fighting antioxidants found in the tea.

Salsa + Avocado = reduced cancer risk and increased immunity. A 2005 study found that folks who ate a ½-cup of avocado with a cup and a half of salsa absorbed 4.4 times more lycopene – a nutrient linked to reduced risk of prostate and ovarian cancers – and 2.6 times more immune-boosting beta carotene.

Whole-grain bread + OJ = more energy. Grains are the most plentiful non-meat source of iron, but iron is better absorbed with vitamin C so coupling your whole-grain bread with a cup of orange juice doubles the amount of iron your body absorbs.

So, take advantage of some of these food combinations! Your body will thank you!

The Lillian E. Lineberger Scholarship was established as an endowment by Mrs. Lineberger to the congregation to reinforce students of the church in their learning and in the accomplishment of an undergraduate or graduate degree. Her hope was that this bequest would help improve their lives, and in turn, serve and enrich the lives of others. Modest scholarships will be awarded to students of the congregation from the fund.
