CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS


All may make the sign of the cross, the sign marked at baptism, as the presiding minister begins.

FIRST READING Isaiah 11:1-10

A reading from the eleventh chapter of Isaiah.

Isaiah describes the coming of a future, ideal ruler who will renew David's royal line (the stump of Jesse). Gifted by the spirit of God, this ruler will reign with perfect justice. Enmity and danger will be restored to harmony and peaceful coexistence.

¹A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots.
²The spirit of the Lord shall rest on him, the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of counsel and might, the spirit of knowledge and the fear of the Lord.
³His delight shall be in the fear of the Lord.

He shall not judge by what his eyes see, or decide by what his ears hear;

4but with righteousness he shall judge the poor, and decide with equity for the meek of the earth; he shall strike the earth with the rod of his mouth, and with the breath of his lips he shall kill the wicked.

5Righteousness shall be the belt around his waist, and faithfulness the belt around his loins.

⁶The wolf shall live with the lamb, the leopard shall lie down with the kid, the calf and the lion and the fatling together, and a little child shall lead them.

⁷The cow and the bear shall graze, their young shall lie down together; and the lion shall eat straw like the ox.

⁸The nursing child shall play over the hole of the asp, and the weaned child shall put its hand on the adder's den.

⁹They will not hurt or destroy on all my holy mountain; for the earth will be full of the knowledge of the Lord as the waters cover the sea.

¹⁰On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious.

SECOND READING Romans 15:4-13

A reading from the fifteenth chapter of Romans.

God's promise to include Gentiles within the circle of God's blessed people has been fulfilled in Jesus Christ. Christians live out their unity by welcoming and encouraging each other just as Christ has welcomed them into God's family.

⁴Whatever was written in former days was written for our instruction, so that by steadfastness and by the encouragement of the scriptures we might have hope. ⁵May the God of steadfastness and encouragement grant you to live in harmony with one another, in accordance with Christ Jesus, ⁶so that together you may with one voice glorify the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ.

⁷Welcome one another, therefore, just as Christ has welcomed you, for the glory of God. ⁸For I tell you that Christ has become a servant of the circumcised on behalf of the truth of God in order that he might confirm the promises given to the patriarchs, ⁹and in order that the Gentiles might glorify God for his mercy. As it is written,

"Therefore I will confess you among the Gentiles,

and sing praises to your name";

¹⁰and again he says,

"Rejoice, O Gentiles, with his people";

¹¹and again,

"Praise the Lord, all you Gentiles,

and let all the peoples praise him";

¹²and again Isaiah says,

"The root of Jesse shall come,

the one who rises to rule the Gentiles;

in him the Gentiles shall hope."

¹³May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit.

'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.'"



⁷But when he saw many Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ⁸Bear fruit worthy of repentance. ⁹Do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our ancestor'; for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children to Abraham. ¹⁰Even now the ax is lying at the root of the trees; every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

¹¹"I baptize you with water for repentance, but one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire. ¹²His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and will gather his wheat into the granary; but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."







Oh, the weather outside is frightful...well, maybe not, but the climate inside is probably getting pretty dry. Humidity drops in the winter and turning up the thermostat sucks even more moisture out of already-dry air. That's why itchy eyes, parched skin, scratchy throats, and stuffy noses are common. Try these tips to alleviate some of the symptoms:

EYES: Don't use artificial tears that contain preservatives - the preservatives can cause further irritation. Use only those that say, "preservative free" and try taking 1,000 milligrams of omega 3 fish

oil daily - it can help reduce redness and irritation.

NOSE: Don't dab petroleum ointment near or in your nostrils. If you are prone to dry-air nosebleeds or discomfort, dab a little antibiotic ointment in your nostrils and moisturize frequently with saline spray.

SKIN: Don't take long, hot showers – they strip the natural oils from the skin. Use warm water and limit your showers to 15 minutes. Bathe with fragrance-free soap that contains added oils and apply moisturizer after every washing, especially when you wash your hands.

THROAT: Don't make coffee your go-to drink – it has a diuretic effect and actually pulls water from your body. Instead drink at least 2 quarts of water daily. Use cough drops or herbal tea with honey to soothe, if needed.

Before we know it, our temps will warm back up and the humidity will be back but, until then, try these tips and feel better!


