



FIRST READING Acts 16:16-34

A reading from Acts, the sixteenth chapter.

The owners of a slave-girl who used her powers to tell fortunes threw Paul and Silas into jail for "healing" her and, consequently, ruining their business. In prison, Paul and Silas bring the good news of the gospel to the jailer and his family.

¹⁶One day, as we were going to the place of prayer, we met a slave-girl who had a spirit of divination and brought her owners a great deal of money by fortune-telling. ¹⁷While she followed Paul and us, she would cry out, "These men are slaves of the Most High God, who proclaim to you a way of salvation." ¹⁸She kept doing this for many days. But Paul, very much annoyed, turned and said to the spirit, "I order you in the name of Jesus Christ to come out of her." And it came out that very hour.

¹⁹But when her owners saw that their hope of making money was gone, they seized Paul and Silas and dragged them into the marketplace before the authorities. ²⁰When they

had brought them before the magistrates, they said, "These men are disturbing our city; they are Jews ²¹and are advocating customs that are not lawful for us as Romans to adopt or observe." ²²The crowd joined in attacking them, and the magistrates had them stripped of their clothing and ordered them to be beaten with rods. ²³After they had given them a severe flogging, they threw them into prison and ordered the jailer to keep them securely. ²⁴Following these instructions, he put them in the innermost cell and fastened their feet in the stocks.

²⁵About midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the prisoners were listening to them. ²⁶Suddenly there was an earthquake, so violent that the foundations of the prison were shaken; and immediately all the doors were opened and everyone's chains were unfastened. ²⁷When the jailer woke up and saw the prison doors wide open, he drew his sword and was about to kill himself, since he supposed that the prisoners had escaped. ²⁸But Paul shouted in a loud voice, "Do not harm yourself, for we are all here." ²⁹The jailer called for lights, and rushing in, he fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. ³⁰Then he brought them outside and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" ³¹They answered, "Believe on the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." ³²They spoke the word of the Lord to him and to all who were in his house. ³³At the same hour of the night he took them and washed their wounds; then he and his entire family were baptized without delay. ³⁴He brought them up into the house and set food before them; and he and his entire household rejoiced that he had become a believer in God.





Walk With God to Wherever, Whenever!

A Journey of Spiritual Faith and Physical Exercise

What is it?

An imaginary walk. The west coast is approximately 2250 miles from Holy Comforter Church. We will attempt a collective walk to the west coast – and back – approximately 4500 miles. Mary and Joseph walked to Bethlehem for the birth of Christ. Jesus walked to Jerusalem for the crucifixion. Of course, Mary, Joseph, and Jesus, didn't start from Belmont which is why this walk will be a collective effort - we will pool our miles. That way, no one has to go terribly far, but hopefully far enough to increase health.

What if I hate to walk?

Well, what do you like to do? Any moderately-paced activity done for 20 minutes that gets your heartbeat up counts. Hiking, biking, rowing, swimming, gardening, raking leaves, golfing, running up/downstairs to do laundry, all count.

Can I sign up my neighbor who wants to participate with me?

Of course. The more walkers, the better. Neighbors, family, boy scout troops...all good! The Parish Nurse has nightmares of nobody signing up and being faced with trying to average 375 miles a week all by herself!

What do I get?

Well, hopefully healthier. But also, a participant packet which includes an instruction sheet, logs to track and report your mileage, weekly words to ponder upon, and a health tidbit loosely related to the scripture.

When does it start?

You may, of course, start at any time. However, the miles begin to count on June 9th. This gives us 12 weeks to complete our journey in time for the end of the program (last miles to be turned in on August 31st) and you can join in at any time.

How do I sign up?

You will need to get a participant packet, either at church at the sign-up location near the coffee in the fellowship hall – OR – by contacting the Parish Nurse who will send it to you via email. If you decide to participate, be sure to sign up so we know you are one of the "collective bunch!"

As part of our process to shape our congregation's purpose and guiding principles, beginning in mid-June and going through the summer our Planting Hope team members will be meeting with folks to build relationships and get to know more about you and your hopes for Holy Comforter. We would love for you to be a part of this! We will have sign ups after worship the first two Sundays in June, or you're welcome to email the church office to volunteer to be a part of this.






