

Treasurer's Report for May 2022

Holy Comforter's operating deficit (expenses in excess of offering income) during May was \$2,670.35. Total giving to support Holy Comforter's routine expenses for the month was \$20,097.00. The budget estimate of the amount needed each month in 2022 is \$26,222.00. The year-to-date deficit, through May 31, was

\$9,534.99. Year-to-date spending was \$12,312.01 below the amount planned in the 2022 budget. The adjacent chart compares this year's offering income, by month, with that of the two previous years. This and last year's budget tracks are also presented in the graph. ~Warren Heller

As shared in previous newsletters we are remembering with fondness the demolition and restoration of our

pipe organ which took place 30 years ago. On Pentecost Sunday, 1992 we heard the old pipe organ for the last time. On the last hymn of the service that day the choir processed along with the entire congregation to the front of the church. We borrowed a fog machine from Belmont Abbey theatre. During the postlude I literally pulled out all the stops and the entire balcony, pipe organ, and organist vanished into a vapor of smoke. Actually, what more appropriate way to go, than

on Pentecost Sunday.

We then removed the pipe work, some of which were shipped to Indiana to be incorporated into the new instrument. Some pipes were donated to other churches to add depth to what they possessed. Volunteers from our church family shared in the demolition, using everything from sledge hammers,

to carefully removing delicate woodwork that could be transformed into small pieces of furniture. That summer involved the removal of pews, carpet, and all of the fabrics were covered in order to pressure wash the entire Sanctuary from floor to ceiling. The balcony was expanded, steel beams were installed by cranes to carry the additional 22,000 lbs of the new organ.

We got by with pianos/keyboards from June until December of that year. More to share about the building process in the coming months. It was an amazing time to watch the instrument come together. Needless to say that this organist got little accomplished that summer. Building a pipe organ is very similar to constructing a house, with the nuances, detail, and decisions that have to be determined.

Holy Comforter Church took a huge leap of faith with our 75th Anniversary project. It truly has been a joy to lead congregational singing in our house of worship. God has blessed us beyond measure!
