Gracious Lord, in awesome wonder, we consider all the works Your hand has made, this church & the gift of nature around us.


We see the stars and hear the mighty thunder, Your power throughout the universe displayed.

Forgive us; renew us; change us; love us.





FIRST READING Acts 17:22–31

A reading from the seventeenth chapter of Acts.

In Athens, Paul faces the challenge of proclaiming the gospel to Greeks who know nothing of either Jewish or Christian tradition. He proclaims that the "unknown god" whom they worship is the true Lord of heaven and earth who will judge the world with justice through Jesus, whom God has raised from the dead.

²²Then Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. ²³For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. ²⁴The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, ²⁵nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. ²⁶From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, ²⁷so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him — though indeed he is not far from each one of us. ²⁸For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said,

'For we too are his offspring.'

²⁹Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. ³⁰While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, ³¹because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."


¹³Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good?


¹⁴But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, ¹⁵but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; ¹⁶yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. ¹⁷For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil.

¹⁸For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, ¹⁹in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, ²⁰who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. ²¹And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you — not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, ²²who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

THE MAASAI CREED

Receive our prayers, merciful God, and dwell in us richly, through Jesus Christ, our life and our redeemer.



"Have You Ever Seen the Holy Spirit?" + Sermon notes

Descriptions of the Holy Spirit:

- Tongues of fire (Acts 2)
- Freely blowing breeze (John 3)

So, what does the Spirit look like?

- Clue #1: The Holy Spirit looks like an advocate (John 14:16)
- o Clue #2: The Holy Spirit looks like Jesus ("another" Advocate)

<u>But wait</u>... when we stand up for another (advocate), when we bear the love of Jesus to another, then do we *also* look like the Spirit? ummm...what does Jesus say as recorded in Matthew's Gospel:

"For I was hungry and you gave Me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave Me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited Me in ... 'Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You something to drink, a stranger and invited You in?' The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers or sisters of mine, you did for Me."

(Matthew 25 from *Today's NIV*)

"We could seek after God, and not just grope around in the dark but actually find Him. God doesn't play hide-and-seek with us. He's not remote; He's near. We live and move in Him, we can't get away from Him!"

(Acts 17 from <u>The Message</u>)
